
SOLUTIONS:

- 1. Increase the supply of housing affordable to households at 60% AMI or below in all neighborhoods.
- 2. Reform zoning and land use policies to allow for a greater variety of housing types throughout the region.
- 3. Preserve existing affordable housing and prevent displacement.
- 4. Increase homeownership opportunities and prevent discrimination for homebuyers.
- 5. Protect the housing rights of individuals who are part of protected groups.
- 6. Reduce housing barriers for people with disabilities.
- 7. Expand access and affordability of public transit.

Eight local governments partnered with the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) to produce a Regional Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (Regional Fair Housing Plan) in 2023: City of Alexandria, VA; Arlington County, VA; the District of Columbia; Fairfax County, VA; City of Gaithersburg, MD; Loudoun County, VA; Montgomery County, MD; and Prince William County, VA. The jurisdictions are required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to affirmatively further fair housing. The Regional Fair Housing Plan will fulfill this HUD requirement and aims to increase collaboration, innovation, and effectiveness of strategies to expand access to safe and affordable housing, increase investment and resources in priority areas, and create more inclusive communities.
