Mr. Harvey will speak about DDOT's Red Top Meter program, a recent initiative to change the parking meter policy for people with disabilities. D.C. officials released a proposal in early October to reserve more than 10% of all parking meters for drivers with disabilities. Mr. Harvey will speak about DDOT's anticipated next steps related to this program.

MAP-21, the recent federal transportation legislation, established the Transportation Alternatives Program to fund small projects like bike and pedestrian improvements, by combining several previous programs. MAP-21 requires MPOs, including the TPB, to play a prominent role in project selection. MAP-21 also consolidated two programs to create an Enhanced Mobility program for seniors and individuals with disabilities. TPB staff will give a brief overview of the new programs and the proposed TPB role in project selection.
