

Traffic Gardens Are a Community Amenity



Fills Bike Education Gaps: Many families lack time, resources, or safe spaces - traffic gardens provide community place to introduce safe biking & road skills.



Reverses Decline in Bike Skills: With biking rates down precipitously over last 15 years, they help rebuild early mobility and independence.




Safe, Hands-On Learning: Traffic gardens offer safe, engaging spaces to build real-world biking and navigation skills through programs and engaging play.



Easy to Install & Scale: Existing paved areas in schools, parks, & other underused spaces make traffic gardens straightforward to set up in many locations



Boosts Health and Community: They promote active play, STEM learning, and serve as hubs for play, programs, and family events.








Many varieties of traffic garden installations

Typical Redeployed Hard Surfaces



One Traffic Garden at a Time Regional Guide



Created through a partnership between Arlington County & Prince George's County

Funded through \$35K award from TPB's Regional Roadway Safety Program

Supports VZ goals to eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries


Includes step-by-step instructions, design templates, local stories, checklists & activity sheets

A unique collaboration & the first cross-state partnership to create shared traffic garden guidance









After first two installed through Vision Zero grant, District of Columbia Public Schools traffic gardens have since been installed through school modernizations. More being added on an ongoing basis. Goal to install in every elementary school.







Demolished Mall Parking Lot The Heights, Vancouver, WA



Intended as a 3-year installation while area is being redeveloped into urban neighborhood. Teamed with artist to create story on surface.
