About Transit Use in the NCR


- There are currently 17 transit providers:
 - 11 local bus operators + Metrobus
 - 1 heavy rail
 - o 3 commuter bus
 - o 2 commuter rail
 - 1 streetcar

230M 2023 MetroRail/MetroBus Ridership


48% 2023 Increase in MetroRail/MetroBus Ridership Over FY22

Motivation for DMVMoves Initiative



- Lack of dedicated (or sufficient) funding for WMATA – particularly for operating since 2018 capital funding agreement
- Regional and local transit operators share heightened financial pressures as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic
- Metro, other regional, and many local operators are now short on necessary funding to cover state of good repair and short to long term operational priorities
- Customers switching between transit systems can have inconsistent experiences due to different methods of operation and policies



DMVMoves – Joint Initiative of COG and Metro

Vision: Transit is the backbone of an integrated, world-class mobility network that makes the National Capital Region a thriving global economy, a preferred home, and a leader in innovation, environmental sustainability, and social equity.









DMVMoves Initiative Structure

Task Force provides direction on key areas of strategic focus



Regional Transit Task Force

Develops vision, plan, action steps, and funding model

Recommends DMVMoves Plan to COG and Metro Boards of Directors for adoption, works to ensure implementation

23 regional leaders


- 18 COG appointees
- 4 WMATA appointees
- 1 Federal representative

Government Partner Advisory Group Community Partner Advisory Group

Provides input and guidance on tasks and deliverables, makes recommendations to Task Force

Government: Chief Administrative Officers, transportation agency executives, and other key stakeholders

Community: Includes business interests, advocacy groups, and community-based organizations



Public input integrated through comments at Task Force meetings and public survey



DMV*Moves* Initiative Structure - Partnerships

Transit Agencies

- Grow ridership and fare revenue
- Contain cost growth
- Report performance, costs, efficiency using consistent approach and data
- Identify opportunities to share resources and unify technologies for cost efficiencies

Jurisdictions

State, counties, cities

- Prioritize existing and create new revenue resources for transit to better align with goals
- Implement transit supportive land use policies

Regional Approach

 Support new public dedicated revenues indexed to inflation for transit

Federal Government

- Index PRIIA to inflation
- Federal support for operations

Transit Users

 Pay modestly increased fares to reflect inflation over time



DMV*Moves* Initiative Structure - Working Groups

Policy Recommendation	Convener
Integrate and align fare policies to provide consistent customer experience	
Adopt shared service guidelines for when and how often transit operates and measure performance	metro
Improve wayfinding, customer information, and amenities at transit stops	
Implement bus priority strategies to get best value from high-frequency routes	Metro
Explore shared use of resources and assets and grouped procurements	
Make training, certification, and inspection programs more consistent across the region	metro



Past Activities

- 3 Task Force Meetings (June, September, December 2024)
- 9 Advisory Group Meetings
- Working Group Meetings Kicked off in November
 - All have met twice, now beginning third meetings
- Special Meetings
 - Joint COG-WMATA Board meeting in May 2024
 - Ongoing one on one meetings as needed with initiative partners

Select Accomplishments

- Development of Working Groups
- Data collection: Regional inventory of assets and financial pictures
- Narrowed scope of funding needs for consideration (not final)
- Local and state jurisdictions more actively focusing on sustainably funding transit in the long-term
- Engagement on creating a more seamless regional transit network
