- COG staff track various bills during the legislative session that fall within COG's legislative priorities


- A series of ad hoc calls are held to determine specific bills to send comment letters on

Virginia Legislation

1. Emissions and Energy Efficiency

- SB 1160: Emissions Intensity target setting to achieve net zero emissions
- SB 1196: Energy Efficiency standards for data center operators
- SB 1353: Water and energy use reporting for data centers
- HB 1883: RPS Standards

2. Infrastructure and Development

- SB 1225/HB 1791: Electric Rural Vehicle Infrastructure Program to assist with development costs
- **HB 2113**: Solar Interconnection Grant Fund and Program: Grants to offset interconnection costs for solar projects
- SB 234: Parking lot solar pilot grant program



Virginia Legislation

3. Financing and Innovation

- HB 2509: Virginia Clean Energy Innovation Board: Financing for clean energy projects, GHG emissions reduction projects, and other qualified projects
- SB 457: Driving Decarbonization Program and Fund



Maryland Legislation

1. Green Energy and Nonprofits

• **HB 145/SB 105**: Establish Green and Renewable Energy for Nonprofit Organizations Loan Program: Zero interest loans for planning, purchase, and installation of qualifying energy structures

2. Climate Change Adaptation

• HB 128/SB 149: Establish Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation payment program: Secure payments from fossil fuel or petroleum products to provide revenue for adaptation and mitigation projects



Federal Policy

Executive Orders

- INITIAL RESCISSIONS OF HARMFUL EXECUTIVE ORDERS AND ACTIONS: Formally rescinds a series of Biden moves that stitched climate and environmental justice throughout federal agency decision-making, going well beyond energy and resource agencies includes a repeal of the Biden administration's Justice 40 Initiative and a 2021 order that set aggressive federal procurement targets for EVs, clean power, low-carbon buildings and more.
- PUTTING AMERICA FIRST IN INTERNATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL AGREEMENTS: Withdraws
 the United States from the Paris Agreement and any agreement, pact, accord, or similar
 commitment made under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.
 The US International Climate Finance Plan is revoked and rescinded immediately.



Federal Policy

Executive Orders

- DECLARING A NATIONAL ENERGY EMERGENCY: Aims to increase domestic energy
 production and lower energy costs. This is partly in response to the rapid Al-related
 growth of data centers and their energy needs, which the administration views through a
 national security lens.
- UNLEASHING AMERICAN ENERGY: Rolls back EPA tailpipe emissions rules and seeks to restart liquified natural gas terminal approvals, which the Biden administration had paused for climate change and energy security grounds.
- TEMPORARY WITHDRAWAL OF ALL AREAS ON THE OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF FROM OFFSHORE WIND LEASING AND REVIEW OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT'S LEASING AND PERMITTING PRACTICES FOR WIND PROJECTS
