**SUBJECT:** Report of the TPB Technical Committee Subcommittees  
**DATE:** March 28, 2025

**Transportation Safety Subcommittee:** On March 4, 2025, the Transportation Safety Subcommittee met virtually to discuss members needs and identify priorities for upcoming meetings in the 2025 calendar year. The member jurisdictions shared safety-related items of interest and discussed the subcommittee's search to find a new Chair.

**Commuter Connections Subcommittee:** On March 18, 2025, the Commuter Connections Subcommittee was briefed on the FY2024 Guaranteed Ride Home (GRH) Customer Satisfaction Survey, updates to the TDM Program Evaluation Framework, and the 2025 State of the Commute survey questionnaire. The subcommittee also discussed plans for the 2025 Bike to Work Day event, CommuterCash and the goDMV Commuter Competition, concluding with a roundtable discussion on Return to Office.

**Bike and Pedestrian Subcommittee:** On March 18, 2025, the Bike and Pedestrian Subcommittee was briefed on the Bikeable Baltimore Region project, as well as a new plan that combines the Fairfax County Bicycle Master Plan and the Countywide Trails Plan to create a more convenient network of active transportation options and trails. The staff shared that there will be an Annual Micromobility workshop in the Spring of 2025 and a Spring Street Smart campaign.

**Travel Forecasting Subcommittee:** On March 21, 2025, the Travel Forecasting Subcommittee received two briefings. The first was on the 2024 TPB Intercity Travel Study. The second was a status update on the development of the COG/TPB Gen3 Travel Demand Forecasting Model, which included recent model enhancements, bugfixes, and the results of a sensitivity test (a hypothetical congestion pricing scheme for the central business district of Washington, D.C.).

**Regional Public Transportation Subcommittee:** On March 25, 2025, the Regional Public Transportation Subcommittee received briefings on several projects both inside and outside of the national capital region, including the MTC's Regional Transit Mapping and Wayfinding Project in the San Francisco Bay Area, Frederick Transit's Service Rebranding, Ride On Flex's 2024 Expansion
