How comments were addressed

Standardized Abbreviations:

All acronyms and terms have been reviewed and made consistent across the document.

Improved Language and Grammar:

The report underwent a full editorial review to correct grammar, improve sentence flow, and enhance clarity.

Clarified Forecast Timeframes:

Clearly stated which years are used for base and forecast periods in all relevant sections.

TAF vs. Memo Projections and Enplanements:

TAF uses fiscal year (Oct-Sept); APS uses calendar year and APS includes only commercial enplanements, while the total on the website includes both commercial and non - commercial.
