12:55 P.M. 8. VISUALIZE 2050: UPDATE ON THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (VDOT) I-495 SOUTHSIDE EXPRESS LANES PROJECT

VDOT staff will provide an update on the development of the I-495 Southside Express Lanes (SEL) project and the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process that is currently underway. In June 2024, TPB requested a second air quality conformity analysis with this project be conducted to provide more time for project technical analysis and discussions to take place. In September, the Board will decide to continue development of Visualize 2050 with or without the SEL project.

1:30 P.M. 9. PRELIMINARY INPUT TO FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION REAUTHORIZATION PROCESS

The federal transportation act, called the Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act, is set to expire on October 1, 2026. The US Congressional process to reauthorize the federal transportation bill is underway and is anticipated to be completed by September 2026. There is an opportunity for stakeholders to submit their inputs, by April 30, 2025, to an online portal established by the Congressional office. In keeping with past practice, TPB would be able to submit its reauthorization principles at this time. The draft authorization principles will be reviewed and members will have an opportunity to provide their suggested changes prior to submission.
