CAFB has mapped out the most likely impacts to our clients and operations

People at risk

- Federal Government RIFs and spending cuts affecting government employees and contractors, leading to an increase in food insecurity
- Immigration policy changes and general atmosphere deterring food insecure communities from seeking food and other services

Programs at risk

- Cuts USDA food programs threaten CAFB food supply
- Cuts to federal food assistance programs (e.g., SNAP) that clients rely on
- Cuts to Medicaid forcing clients to choose between food and healthcare

Other risks

- Tariffs on food and other materials in CAFB's supply chain (e.g., aluminum) + impact on clients
- Supply chain bottlenecks
 from various policies (e.g.,
 stop-payments to contracted
 truckers)
- **Skepticism of DEI** (e.g., elimination of certain funding)

Possible increase in USDA food as the government buys excess from U.S. farmers
