What Is the TIP and Why a Public Forum?

- It represents the implementation of the first 4 years of the long-range plan
- Planned schedule for expenditures for projects and programs through fiscal year 2029
 - Shows *planned funding* for project implementation (planning & engineering, right-of-way acquisition, construction) but doesn't guarantee that's when those activities will occur
- Requirement for projects to receive federal formula funding from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) or Federal Transit Administration (FTA)
- Narrowly focused on federal funding and federal requirements, does not include all projects in the region
 - Every Metropolitan Planning Organization in a non-attainment area must hold a formal public meeting during the development of the TIP



Goals for the Public Forum

- Provide an opportunity for attendees to learn about the FY 2026-2029 TIP
 - Development Process
 - Draft Analysis of Projects and Programs
- Fulfill regulatory requirements for holding a public meeting on the TIP
 - Co-hosted by DDOT to meet one of their public involvement requirements
