- The current transportation funding bill (Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act – IIJA) is set to expire on September 30, 2026. Through the transportation reauthorization process, Congress updates federal policies to address the nation’s evolving infrastructure needs and challenges, and shapes how federal transportation funds are allocated. Staff will provide an overview of the federal reauthorization process, details on the newly introduced “Basics Act”, and information on the impacts to MPOs.
