Background: At the March 15 meeting, notice was provided that VDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2006-2011 TIP that is exempt from the air quality conformity requirement to add \$20.145 million for the widening of I-66 between US 29 and VA 234 and to advance the construction schedule from July 2008 to July 2006, as described in the enclosed materials.

These amendments would not require any changes to the air quality conformity analysis conducted for the FY 2006-2011 TIP.

**RESOLUTION ON AN AMENDMENT TO
THE FY 2006-2011 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)
THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT
TO MODIFY THE FUNDING AND CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE FOR WIDENING I-66
BETWEEN US 29 AND VA 234 IN PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY AS REQUESTED BY
THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (VDOT)**

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act - A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, on October 19, 2005 the TPB adopted the 2005 Constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan (CLRP) and the FY 2006-2011 TIP; and

WHEREAS, At the March 15, 2006 TPB meeting, notice was provided that VDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2006-2011 TIP that is exempt from the air quality conformity requirement to add \$20.145 million for the widening of I-66 between US 29 and VA 234 and to advance the construction schedule from July 2008 to July 2006 as described in the attached materials; and

WHEREAS, the change in funding and timing for this project does not affect the air quality conformity determination of the 2005 CLRP and the FY 2006-2011 TIP;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION TRANSPORTATION PLANNING BOARD amends the FY 2006-2011 TIP to add \$20.145 million for the widening of I-66 between US 29 and VA 234 and to advance the construction schedule from July 2008 to July 2006, as described in the attached materials.

Dear Chairman Knapp:

On behalf of itself, VDOT requests an amendment (attached) to the FY 2006-2011 Transportation Improvement Programs (TIP). This project, I-66 from US 29 to VA 234, involves constructing two lanes in each direction, including a concurrent flow HOV lane. Originally, the project was scheduled for construction in July 2008 at a cost of \$ 77 million dollars. This amendment will increase the construction estimate to \$ 97 million dollars, and more importantly, advance the project two years, to July 2006. This cost change is due to increase in construction material unit costs and construction engineering inspection, and enhanced maintenance of traffic. This project has been included in previous conformity analysis.


The additional funds for the cost increase are from two other VDOT projects: I-95's fourth lane from Newington to the Occoquan and the I-66 interchange reconstruction at US 29 and Linton Hall Road in Gainesville. Both of these projects received earmarks in SAFETEA-LU, thus facilitating the transfer of funds. Neither project's schedule or finances will be adversely affected by this fund transfer.

VDOT requests that this amendment be approved by the Transportation Planning Board at its meeting on March 15, 2006.
