DATE: May 21, 2025

The Transportation Planning Board accepts public comment on a rolling basis. Comments can be submitted via email (tpbcomment), mail, and phone. Comments are collected until noon on the day before the TPB meeting. These comments are compiled and shared with the board at the meeting the following day.

Between noon Monday, April 14, and noon Tuesday, May 20 the TPB received five letters, one comment in the general comment box, and 259 comments submitted via email.

The comments are summarized below. All full comments are attached to this memo.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Scott A. Surovell, Virginia State Senate, Comments via Letter- April 25, 2025

Majority Leader Surovell writes that his constituents attended the meetings held by VDOT on the I-495 Southside Express Lanes Study. They overwhelmingly expressed disapproval of the project, citing their concerns with the traffic implications on I-495 and secondary roads, environmental impacts, and limiting future options for multimodal transit. He urges the TPB to vote against including the project in Visualize 2050. He writes residents living within the Mixing Bowl and the Potomac, as well as the State of Maryland, oppose it. He notes that the additional lanes on Woodrow Wilson Bridge were reserved for transit pursuant to a FHWA Record of Decision in 2000, which is consistent with the operating agreement the three states signed in 2001. He remains unconvinced that VDOT is adequately considering these issues and concludes that the project is not ready to be included in the region's transportation plan.

Barbara Coufal, Citizens Against Beltway Expansion, Comments via Letter- May 19, 2025 Ms. Coufal writes to reiterate their strong opposition to the Southside toll lanes and to urge the Board to exclude the project from Visualize 2050. The letter states that the project will not resolve congestion, just move the Virginia bottlenecks to Oxon Hill; that VDOT will not conduct an analysis of

the impact on local roads before the TPB vote; and that VDOT will use their veto in the future to block Metrorail over the bridge to protect the toll lanes. The letter also states that VDOT has failed to study alternatives to building toll lanes such as a short term use of highway shoulders for bus and carpools; that the toll lanes would preclude extension of Metrorail, and that the public does not support the project.

Patricia Jackman, Maryland Coalition for Responsible Transit, Comments via Letter-May 20, 2025 The coalition writes to urge exclusion of the Southside Express Lanes from Visualize 2050, stating that while WMATA is prioritizing bus improvements currently, space on the bridge must be preserved for future Metrorail expansion. They write they are not confident in VDOT's assurances that toll lanes could be converted, and that Virginia would use their veto to preserve the toll lanes. They ask that the option of extending the Blue Line not be put at risk.

Jessica Hart, DC Families for Safe Streets, Comments via Letter- May 20,2025

The organization applauds the awards being announced for the Safe Street and Roads for All program but are concerned that funds are being left on the table. They ask if COG is applying for the SS4A grant available through USDOT. They also state that inviting Families for Safe Street chapters and other community-based organizations can count toward non-federal match requirements. They cite the TPB Participation Plan Evaluation Final Report suggesting that best practice is to leverage community-based groups such as theirs. They urge the TPB to center the experience of those personally impacted by traffic violence in their safety efforts.

Janet Gallant, Don't Widen 270, Comments via Letter- May 20, 2025

The organization writes in opposition to the Southside Expressways project, stating that VDOT's analysis shows that the Maryland public rejects the harm, risk, costs and lost opportunities the project would bring. Among their concerns are ending the chance of rail; traffic bottlenecks in Oxon Hill and if built, the lanes becoming a problem for future Maryland governors with limited ability to stop toll lane expansion around the beltway. They state that the TPB would not see the impact on connecting roads until after they vote because VDOT will not conduct a traffic analysis until after the preferred alternative is selected. They also state that a private, for-profit partner will increase inequity for the public who are unable to afford high tolls.

General Comment Form Submissions

One comment was received in the General Comment box on May 20, 2025. Dr. Terry Fitzgerald wrote requesting to provide oral comment.

Email Campaigns- Comments via Email- April 23 to May 21, 2025

The TPB received 259 emails from Wednesday, April 23 until noon Tuesday. Email campaigns included content urging the TPB Board to *reject* the currently proposed I-495 Express Lane project, and content urging the TPB to *include* the proposed project. The emails were generated from email-writing software, with some capacity to tailor the email contents. One email contained the same content as the campaign last month but was received after the cut-off date for the April meeting.

Email forms for removal of the project (4) were similar to last month's, urging the board to vote to remove the I-495 Southside Express toll lanes project from Visualize 2050, calling on VDOT to provide more information to impacted jurisdictions and fairly evaluate other alternatives such as shoulder/bus HOV with carpool/transit expansion, look at impacts to local arterials, and the cost of removing HOT lanes to accommodate Metrorail. The email claims that VDOT has been biased from the start that that officials should not be making such decisions based on incomplete information.

The TPB received an additional 255 emails from Wednesday, April 16 until noon Tuesday from community members urging support of the I-495 Express Lane project. Notable was the number of emails that appeared to originate in Prince Georges County. There were five variations of content. "Southside Beltway Improvements Will Alleviate Congestion and Traffic Jams," "Southside Beltway Improvements Project is Needed," "Please Improve the Capital Beltway," Please Move Forward with Southside Beltway Improvements" and "Support Southside Beltway Improvements." All forms were similar in content, stating that there has been success with express lanes in Northern Virginia and Prince George's County residents would see similar benefits, and that transit systems are experiencing financial constraints and this project is an opportunity to allocate more funds to transit in Prince Georges County. The forms also mention congestion relief and ongoing collaboration between Virginia and Prince George's County.

Four emails contained some variation in content from the forms provided. There was one instance of the same individual submitting comments using two or more fillable forms.

Re: I-495 Southside Express Lanes Project

Dear Chair Walkinshaw and Commissioner Brich:

Earlier this month, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) hosted a series of public hearings to gather public feedback on the I-495 Southside Express Lanes Study. Hundreds of my constituents along with representatives from my office attended the two meetings held in my district. The community members who attended these meetings overwhelmingly expressed disapproval of the project, citing their serious concerns about the traffic implications on I-495 and adjacent secondary and neighborhood streets, potential environmental impacts, and the likelihood that expanding express lanes over this stretch of I-495 would severely limit future options for multimodal transit, including rail, bicycle, and pedestrian transportation.

As the Transportation Planning Board considers whether VDOT's Southside Express Lanes project will be included in the region's transportation plan, Visualize 2050, I am writing on behalf of my constituents to ask that you vote against expanding toll lanes on I-495. The half million residents who live between the Mixing Bowl and the Potomac River in Fairfax County and the City of Alexandria oppose this project along with the State of Maryland. I am not clear why we continue to invest taxpayer dollars in a project that is not supported by the State of Maryland and requires their consent.

As someone who personally commutes on I-495 between the Woodrow Wilson Bridge and Braddock Rd. every day, I am acutely aware of the current traffic bottlenecks and exorbitant costs to use the existing HOT lanes. I share the concerns of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA), Maryland Officials, the Mayor of the City of Alexandria, regional advocacy groups such as the Coalition for Smart Growth, and members of the public regarding the proposed use of the center lanes on the Woodrow Wilson Bridge for vehicle traffic.

Taxpayers have now invested:

- \$676 million on the Springfield Mixing Bowl;
- \$2.357 billion on the Woodrow Wilson Bridge;
- \$1.4 billion (and counting) on the I-495 HOT Express Lanes.

Traffic congestion is the same as it was in 1999 and the expansion of vehicle lanes has proven that it does not work. We need to be focused on making investments in high capacity transit instead of continuing to throw money at road expansions.

Constructing this project would create a major new traffic bottleneck on the Maryland side of the Woodrow Wilson Bridge. In this study, VDOT fails to consider any alternative to HOT lanes such as piloting express bus and HOV on shoulder lanes, or providing increased incentives for commuters to use public transit and carpool. The study's focus on HOT lanes alone without providing an analysis of their efficacy at reducing congestion in comparison to alternative proposals will inevitably lead to a skewed study conclusion that fails to accurately assess the best path forward for our region. Additionally, VDOT must conduct an in-depth study regarding how the impacts of climate change will affect this construction. Should it proceed to construction, the project will be heavily impacted by sea level rise and the increase in rainfall intensity that climate scientists expect to see over the coming century, and a failure to plan for these changes is shortsighted.

Finally, the additional lanes on the Woodrow Wilson Bridge were reserved for transit pursuant to the Federal Highway Administration (FHA) Record of Decision dated June 16, 2000 - not vehicular traffic. This is also consistent with the Woodrow Wilson Bridge Operating Agreement entered into by three states on September 7, 2001 which cannot be changed without the consent of Maryland and the District of Columbia. While I recognize that VDOT is taking steps to make it possible for the lanes to be converted to rail in future years, securing the political will to convert interstate vehicle lanes to rail is politically unrealistic and is not authorized by the FHA.

These comments are consistent with our position since this project was first proposed. I remain unconvinced that VDOT is adequately considering these issues. Given the volume and tenor of public opinion on this proposed project, it is clear that the residents of Northern Virginia see little benefit to expanding HOT lanes and have serious increasing concerns and the impact the project will have on their everyday lives. This proposal is far from ready to be included in the region's transportation plan, and I request that the Transportation Planning Board vote against including the I-495 Southside Express Lanes project in Visualize 2050 this fall.

Thank you for receiving these comments and taking our position and that of our constituents into consideration.

Dear Chair Walkinshaw and Members of the TPB:

Following the Virginia Dept. of Transportation's (VDOT) recent public presentations on the Southside Express Lanes, I write to reiterate our strong opposition to the Southside toll lanes and to urge the Board to exclude the project from Visualize 2050.

- The Southside toll lanes would not resolve congestion, just move Virginia bottlenecks to Oxon Hill;
- VDOT will not conduct an analysis of the impact on local roads before the TPB votes on the project;
- We can count on VDOT to use their veto in the future to block Metrorail over the Woodrow Wilson Bridge to protect the toll lanes.

One of the many flaws of toll lanes is that they create huge bottlenecks where ever toll lanes end. That is because all the traffic in the toll lanes is forced to merge into general lanes. The Southside toll lanes would end in Oxon Hill at Maryland Route 210 where it would create a severe backup. We know this based on the experience of the toll lanes built between Springfield and Old Dominion Drive on the Virginia Beltway. In November 2014, a report by the Virginia Office of Public-Private Partnerships noted that the terminus of toll lanes at Old Dominion Drive was causing a 2.5-mile backup in the general lanes during evening rush hour. We can expect similarly severe backups on the Beltway in the Oxon Hill area, where the Southside toll lanes would end.

VDOT has failed to provide the public with an analysis of the impact of the Southside toll lanes on local roads, including MD Route 210, U.S. Route 1, Telegraph Road and Van Dorn Street. VDOT will not conduct any analysis until after public hearings this summer and after the TPB votes on the project in September. No vote should be taken by the TPB without Board members and the public understanding these critical impacts. In particular, we would highlight the need to understand the impacts on MD Route 210, which is also known as the "highway of death" due to the number of vehicle crashes and pedestrian fatalities. Increased congestion would make Route 210 even less safe.

VDOT has failed to study alternatives to building toll lanes. They did not study a short-term use of the highway shoulders for buses and carpooling, and encouraging greater bus ridership and

carpooling with financial incentives. They did not study the innovative congestion management program that has reduced congestion on I-270 in Montgomery County. They did not study the use of Virginia's own technology program, RM3P. They did not study the use of financial incentives to encourage employers to implement more telework, which the TPB has found would be the most effective measure to reduce traffic congestion in the region. Most importantly, they did not study an extension of Metro's Blue Line into Prince George's County which would provide a more efficient transportation option and take vehicles off the Beltway.

The Southside toll lanes would block a future extension of Metrorail by taking space on the Woodrow Wilson Bridge reserved for rail. VDOT has the power to veto a future extension of Metrorail over the Bridge. They would surely use that veto power to avoid the expense of compensating Transurban for the loss of toll revenue.

Finally, I would note that the public is not persuaded that toll lanes are the answer. VDOT shared some polling results in their presentations to the public and the TPB. But they did not explain that the polling shows that the public prefers transit and carpool options over toll lanes. When presented with such options, the public chose toll lanes as the <u>last option</u>. Only when VDOT presented toll lanes as the only option, did the public show support for them.

We urge the TPB to exclude the Southside Express Lanes from Visualize 2050.

To: James Walkinshaw, Chair National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board, The Maryland Coalition for Responsible Transit is submitting comments regarding the Southside Express Lanes proposal. MCRT is a nonprofit organized to evaluate transit projects for safety, social equity, environmental impact, economic viability, and community accessibility. We work with our coalition members to inform the public and decision makers.

MCRT urges the TPB to exclude the Southside Express Lanes from Visualize 2050. It would be irresponsible to allow the Virginia Department of Transportation to use space on the Woodrow Wilson Bridge that was reserved for rail transit. While WMATA is prioritizing improvements in its bus service at this time, space on the Bridge must be preserved for a future extension of the Blue Line. As it was aptly stated by Virginia Senate Majority Leader Scott Surovell in a letter to the TPB, "...the expansion of vehicle lanes has proven that it does not work. We need to be focused on making investments in high-capacity transit instead of continuing to throw money at road expansions."

We are not confident in VDOT's assurances that the toll lanes could be converted to rail in the future. Virginia has the power to veto a WMATA rail project across the Bridge, and we expect they will use that veto to preserve their toll lanes.

Unlike expensive toll lanes, rail transit is an efficient, equitable and sustainable transportation solution. The option to extend the Blue Line should not be put at risk. We urge the TPB to exclude the Southside Express Lanes from Visualize 2050.

Testimony from Jessica Hart on behalf of the DC chapter of Families for Safe Streets before the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments Transportation Planning Board Wednesday, May 21, 2025

Summary

- Families for Safe Streets represents victims and survivors of vehicular crashes.
- We are community-based champions for proven safety countermeasures like those outlined in the COG's FY 2026 Regional Roadway Safety Project Recommendations.
- While we applaud the \$320K of awards being announced, we are concerned funds are being left on the table. What opportunity is there for deserving yet unfunded applications for this regional round of awards to be put forward as a Safe Streets and Roads for All application to USDOT?
- Is the COG applying for the SS4A grant? USDOT has \$1 billion available this year the deadline for applications is June 26.
- Inviting FSS chapters and other community-based organizations to have a role in these
 efforts can count toward <u>non-federal match requirements</u> for federal funding
 opportunities.
- The TPB Participation Plan Implementation Evaluation Final Report (2022) suggests that a best practice for the COG would be "leveraging community organizations and other groups and people who have existing ties to people with different racial, ethnic, and linguistic backgrounds." As a community-based victim/survivor organization, FSS would bring these kinds of perspectives to the table.
- We urge the COG to center the experience of those personally impacted by traffic violence as you formulate your safety efforts. FSS is ready to support your efforts to do that.

Introduction

Good afternoon Chair Walkinshaw and esteemed board members of the Transportation Planning Board.

My name is Jessica Hart and I am testifying on behalf of the DC chapter of Families for Safe Streets. Our mission is to confront the preventable epidemic of traffic violence by advocating for life-saving changes and providing support to those who have been impacted by crashes. My five-year-old daughter Allie was killed while riding her bike in a crosswalk in 2021, and I am here today because I cannot accept that my child is dead and nothing else changes.

In 2021, the year Allie was killed, 40 people were killed on DC streets. Four-year-old Zy'aire Joshua, 24-year-old aspiring opera singer Nina Larson, 20-year-old Jamya Williams, who dreamed of being a cardiologist. In 2022, it was 35, including artists Jane Bloom and Terese Duddnick Taffer on Connecticut Avenue and Anthony Shaw on the notoriously dangerous Southern Avenue. In 2023, 52 people, like Madison Jones, William Lamont Walker, Andy Cariño, James Tarrants, Nijad Huseynov, and Peter Black, lost their lives. In 2024, it was again 52 lives. Sixty two-year-old Alton Kelly and his wife, who survived but is recovering from her own injuries while mourning the loss of her beloved husband. Brianna Anderson who was using a wheelchair. Five-year-old Zyinya Crump on her way home from school. Every person should still be alive today.

This is unacceptable. We need your help.

Our growing membership in the National Capital Region extends across chapters in DC, Fairfax County, Arlington County, the City of Alexandria, and Montgomery County.

Our Vision

We envision a region where all road users – including people who are walking, biking, rolling, and in vehicles – can safely co-exist, and where children and adults can travel freely without risk of harm. We believe that no loss of life in traffic crashes is acceptable or inevitable. Traffic crashes are not "accidents" – they are preventable through policy changes, infrastructure improvements, and a true commitment to implementing the Safe System approach.

Who here has been personally impacted by a traffic crash or knows someone who has? [show of hands]

In our region, one of us dies nearly daily and thousands of our neighbors are injured by vehicular crashes each year.

This impact burden falls disproportionately on our most vulnerable residents in low-income communities.

These are not just statistics – we are fathers, mothers, children, and neighbors whose lives are cut short by preventable crashes. This is the loss of bread-winners for families, of stability and security - and added, avoidable trauma reverberating through our lives.

Request for COG Leadership

The Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments - has a unique opportunity to demonstrate bold, regional leadership.

We need your leadership and respectfully urge the COG to:

- Embrace a more vocal and visible leadership role in championing safe streets for our entire region recognizing that we live regionally and across jurisdictional lines.
- Center those personally impacted by traffic violence in all transportation safety decision-making.
- Prioritize safety over speed in all transportation policy and planning.
- Coordinate regional efforts to implement proven safety countermeasures, particularly on high-injury corridors that cross jurisdictional boundaries.
- Support and promote the Safe System approach endorsed by the US Department of Transportation.
- The TPB Participation Plan Implementation Evaluation Final Report (2022) suggests that a best practice for the COG would be "leveraging community organizations and other groups and people who have existing ties to people with different racial, ethnic, and linguistic backgrounds." As a community-based victim/survivor organization, FSS would bring these kinds of perspectives to the table.
- We urge the COG to center the experience of those personally impacted by traffic violence as you formulate your safety efforts. FSS is ready to support your efforts to do that.

SS4A Grant Opportunities

We understand that securing funding for safety improvements is a significant challenge. The <u>USDOT's Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant program</u> is providing \$1 billion this year to support local planning and capital improvement to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries. The deadline for submitting applications is June 26.

We would like to know - is the COG applying for SS4A grants?

Our chapter would welcome the opportunity to be a collaborating party on these applications in any way that is best supportive of the effort to secure resources for our communities. As victims and survivors of traffic violence, we bring invaluable community-based, lived experience to safety planning and implementation and the moral authority to urge action.

We are aware that non-federal match requirements can be a barrier to applying for these grants. However, we want to highlight that in-kind match from community groups like ours is eligible. Volunteer hours and community engagement can potentially count toward the required 20% non-federal match for SS4A grants. Is this something that the COG is willing to consider?

Engaging community-based organizations like Families for Safe Streets will help the COG meet its own goals for community engagement outlined in the COG's own public involvement process evaluation. We appreciate your efforts and are here as a strong community voice to support our decision-makers in taking action.

Conclusion

In closing, we urge the COG to rise to its potential as a visible and vocal regional leader and champion for safe streets. By coordinating efforts across jurisdictions, centering the experiences of those most affected by traffic violence, and pursuing available federal funding, the COG can help prevent further needless deaths and injuries on our roadways.

We stand ready to collaborate with you in this critical work. Thank you for your time and consideration.

Comments on VDOT's Proposed Southside Express Lanes

DontWiden270.org is part of a broad advocacy coalition that strongly opposes private, forprofit toll lanes on the Woodrow Wilson Bridge and the Maryland Beltway in Prince George's County.

VDOT's own analyses show the Maryland public clearly rejects the harm, risk, costs, and lost opportunities the project would bring. Among our concerns are the following:

- The Southside project would effectively end the chance of extending the Metro Blue Line across the Woodrow Wilson Bridge. WMATA's recent decision to deemphasize rail expansion is a response to the region's current fiscal reality. Longterm plans for the Blue Line remain. Despite VDOT's assurances that they and the private partner would build and then remove express lanes and overpass ramps to accommodate rail, such a construction/destruction plan is highly unlikely.
- The Southside project would create a major new traffic bottleneck at Oxon Hill, MD, where the toll lanes end. As we've seen in Northern Virginia, the only "solution" to toll lane-created bottlenecks is to build **more** toll lanes, which in turn create more bottlenecks.
- If the Southside toll lanes are built in Maryland, the resulting bottlenecks will leave future Maryland governors with an intractable problem and limited ability to stop private, for-profit toll lane expansion all around the Beltway.
- The Southside project would seriously impact connecting roads in Prince George's County. Transportation Planning Board members will have to vote on the project without seeing the critical data on how the roads will be affected. That is because VDOT will not conduct its traffic impact analyses until after a preferred alternative is selected.
- The Southside express toll lanes, built by a private, for-profit partner, will increase inequity and congestion for the vast majority of the public unable to afford the high tolls. A Federal Highway Administration website explains the managed toll lane business model this way: "Revenue potential and overall financial success depends on the operational failure of adjacent general purpose lanes. There must be congestion and worsening conditions in order to implement pricing" (https://ops.fhwa.dot.gov/freewaymgmt/publications/documents/nrpc0610/proceedings/session1.htm).

We believe the Southside Express Lanes will harm – not benefit – the Maryland public. We urge VDOT to turn instead to the many viable alternatives already on the table. And we urge the TPB not to include the Southside project in Visualize 2050.

As a resident of the Springfield area who routinely commutes to Tysons Corner along the existing High Occupancy Toll (HOT) lanes, I strongly agree that VDOT needs to provide more information to the public and impacted jurisdictions, and fairly evaluate other alternatives before proceeding to select a "preferred alternative" to the plan to extend the HOT lanes to Oxon Hill, MD. My own experience with this commute is that the existing lanes have done little to improve traffic conditions along I-495.
