

2025 DMV UPWARD MOBILITY COHORT

- Registration OPEN now until January 31st
- No direct cost supported by Gates Foundation
- Jurisdictions expectations:
 - Complete Pre-work: includes Asset mapping & Stakeholder Analysis
 - Form a team (can be inside/outside government)
 - Participate in all sessions (in person/virtual)
 - Identify and pursue local application of tools based on selected pilot
