Emma will share her journey building and scaling her diversified vegetable farm to what it is today: a thriving, year-round operation that serves individuals, restaurants, schools, and other organizations. She will provide a tour of the farm, including its aggregation facility which also receives, stores, and distributes products from Moon Valley partner farms.

1:00 pm: Tour Catoctin Mountain Orchard

Meet with Bob Black, second generation co-owner and Katelyn Robertson, the fourth generation of Catoctin Mountain Orchard, to learn about their orchard and how this family farm has overcome challenges and opportunities. Catoctin Mountain Orchard was the first farm in the area to sell to schools, growing apples specifically for the schools that are smaller and easier for children to handle. This diversified farm grows apples, peaches, pears, nectarines, plums, and variety of vegetables and flowers. Bob was inducted into the International Fruit Growers Hall of Fame in 2025.

Participants will have time to use the restroom and explore the Orchard's onfarm market if they would like to.
