Transportation Transformation: Emerging Electric Drive Industry

- 30 Hybrid-Electric models currently available
- 4 'Production' Plug-in Electric Vehicles
Nissan Leaf | GM Volt | Tesla Roadster | Ford-Azure Transit Connect
- 20+ PEV models introduced by 2012
- 43% Year-Over-Year Growth for EV's
- 22,000 charging stations being installed
- \$10B infrastructure investment
- Operating Cost: \$1.00 - \$1.50 day (40 mile/day commuter)
- High Performance / Low Maintenance
- Top Safety Rating (Insurance Institute for Highway Safety)
- Reduce CO2 emissions by 50+%
- Leaf / Volt – 'Car of the Year'
