

Meeting Highlights TPB Technical Committee – April 3, 2026

The following items were reviewed for inclusion on the TPB's April agenda:

BIKE TO WORK DAY PROCLAMATION

The committee received a briefing on Bike to Work Day event, which will bring 105 local pit stops across the metropolitan Washington region together to encourage bicycle commuting through bicycle-friendly policies and initiatives. This year's Bike to Work Day is scheduled on Friday, May 15, 2026.

DMVMOVES WORK PLAN

The committee received a briefing on the work plan for TPB staff, in coordination with WMATA and local agency transit staff, to advance the DMVMoves Detailed Action Plan for Regional Transit Integration, part of the DMVMoves Plan endorsed last November by the COG and WMATA boards of directors and by the TPB in January.

TRANSPORTATION REAUTHORIZATION: STATUS OF THE FEDERAL PROCESS AND OVERVIEW OF THE "BASICS ACT"

The committee received a briefing on the current transportation funding bill (Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act – IIJA), which is set to expire on September 30, 2026. Through the transportation reauthorization process, Congress updates federal policies to address the nation's evolving infrastructure needs and challenges, and shapes how federal transportation funds are allocated.

The following items were presented for information and discussion:

FY 2026 CMP TECHNICAL REPORT

The committee received a briefing on the FY2026 CMP Technical Report, a featured product of TPB's enhanced Congestion Management Process (CMP). TPB staff highlighted CMP program enhancements it is developing to make products more user-friendly and engaging to more clearly convey the story of congestion across the TPB region.

OVERVIEW OF TPB'S POLICY FRAMEWORK, THE ROLE OF PERFORMANCE MEASURES, AND UPCOMING PERFORMANCE MEASURES WORK ACTIVITIES

The committee received a briefing on the TPB's Policy Framework and how performance measures support the TPB's assessment of the region's progress towards meeting its goals. TPB staff provided an overview of federal performance measures, the staff involved in the work, as well as the timelines for assessing current performance and adopting new targets.
