1:10 P.M. 8. ENHANCED MOBILITY: INCREASING TRAVEL OPTIONS FOR UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS

The Board will be provided with an overview of the federal Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility grants solicitation process, which begins with pre-application conferences in July and the solicitation period in August/September. The TPB will approve the projects later this fall. Enhanced Mobility provides funding for transportation for people with disabilities and older adults who have difficulty using public transportation. The program provides approximately \$10 million every 2 years in matching grant funds for non-profit organizations, local governments, transit agencies, and private for-profit providers.
